

# Ted Hagerman



Construction was Ted Hagerman's passion, and he combined his understanding of construction with his passion for it as a business. The original company, Buesching-Hagerman & Company was founded in 1908 by brothers-in-law William C. Hagerman and Frederick C. Buesching. In 1934, the company became known as Hagerman Construction.

During this time, William's sons, Ted and Pete, assumed leadership of the company. Ted Hagerman was instrumental in the development of Interstate Industrial Park and also developed a design-build-lease program that led to the construction of Northcrest Shopping Center. Ted retired from day-to-day operations but continued serving as chairman of the company's board in 1978. He remained involved in Hagerman Construction and its effort until his death in February 1999.
